Calow Primary wins Chesterfield Council Awards

Calow School has always had an impressive record in the 'Chesterfield in Bloom' competition but this year is exceptional. We have had two prize winners in the Council's painting competition. During the summer you may have seen Freya and Reece's winning art work displayed on banners around the town. Both pupils were invited to an awards ceremony to receive their prizes from the Mayor. At the same time, Calow was presented with trophies for winning first place in the categories of 'Best Environmental Garden' and 'Wonderful Wildlife'. Links with the local community

The School Choir were invited to Goodman Court for an afternoon as part of national 'Older People's Day' on 1st October. The children were able to talk with senior citizens and listen to reminiscences. The Choir then sang a selection of songs. The Choir Master from Chesterfield's Crooked Spire visited School to carry out auditions. He was very impressed by the standard of singing and several children have been selected with the hope of joining the world famous choir. Calow Primary is participating in Local Democracy Week commencing 12th October. Pupils will be learning more about how British democracy works. This will include visits from elected members of the local community, for example the Chair of Calow Parish Council, to explain more about their roles. Year Six pupils will also be voting to elect the Parish's Child Bishop. Our School will be the venue for the Rotary Club of Chesterfield's Annual Verse Speaking competition on 22nd October. Last year a Calow pupil came second so we hope to do well again.

We have been overwhelmed by the generosity this year of those who donated produce for the Harvest Festival. Literacy Week starts on 19th October

This year is the 600th anniversary of the Battle of Agincourt, an event that changed the course of History. To coincide with national commemorations, we are staging a Literacy Week starting on Monday 19th October. The curriculum will be linked to opportunities for reading and writing based on the Agincourt theme. For younger children we are basing the week on 'knights of old' to simplify matters. During the week Key Stage Two pupils will participate in archery sessions. There will be a fancy dress day when children can come to School on Friday 23rd October in Agincourt/knights costume; there are prizes to be won! Year Six pupils are invited to an Agincourt exhibition at Leeds Armouries on 18th October. Transport to and from the museum has been organised by Calow Primary.
